W: Twenty-two minutes from here.

M: OK. Thanks.

M: How can I help?

W: I'd like to report a lost wallet.

M: I see. Do you have any idea where you lost it?

W: It was probably at lunchtime. I remember sitting down on the grass near the pond to have a sandwich and a coffee.
