Part One.

### Question 1:

Part Two.

*Interviewer:* Some of the people listening today have probably seen a few new Japanese faces on the streets of Barrie this week. Anne Jones is here to tell us why. Anne, thank you for coming to visit us in our radio station today.

*Coordinator:* I'm very happy to be here. I'm the coordinator and guide for a group of thirty students from Japan who are here in Barrie for two weeks to stay with local families and learn about Canadian culture. At the same time, they help our local people understand something about Japanese culture.

*Interviewer:* Right, I see. So, are they from all over Japan?

*Coordinator:* Actually, they're all from a school in Tokyo called Aoyama Gakuin. For about ten years they've been sending students here for this homestay program. It's a senior high school, so the students are sixteen to eighteen years old.

*Interviewer:* And what's your link to the school, Anne? Do you work for them?

*Coordinator:* No, that's not it. I teach here in Ontario, but about twelve years ago I worked in Japan. I speak a little Japanese, and I love the culture. I found this job thanks to a friend in Toronto. My sister now works for the same company, too. In fact, we're both going on the same trip tomorrow.

*Interviewer:* So what is a normal day like for the students?

*Coordinator:* Well, the host families understand that it is important to have meals with the Japanese students and to encourage them to talk as much as possible. After breakfast, the host families drive the students to the meeting place, and from there we use a big, yellow school bus for the day's activities.

*Interviewer:* What type of activities do you do?

*Coordinator:* Well, you see, that's why I really love this program! The students have a lot of fun. Some of the activities introduce the Japanese students to local people. For example, one day we meet some younger children on a YMCA summer camp, and the Japanese students teach them things like origami and traditional Japanese cooking. Another day, we go to a home for the elderly, and they can meet people of different ages. We also go on lots of trips, of course, to famous places like Niagara Falls and Wasaga Beach. But we also take them to places that are environmentally important but not very famous, like Wye Marsh. We also visit places that are important to our history, like the Jesuit Settlement of Sainte Marie. It's a little expensive, but it's usually only visited by local people.

*Interviewer:* That all sounds great! It must be a very busy two weeks!

*Coordinator:* It is, but, as I said, it's great fun! Thank you for inviting me onto the program today to talk about it.
